Playwright Julia Lederer further developed the script in Los Angeles, at the Theatre @ Boston Court, as part of their 2017 Polly Warfield Award-winning season. After hit productions in LA. Chicago, Boise, Alaska, Paris, etc. this script has yet to be produced in Canada, Until now, as it returns to launch the new PRIMETIME FESTIVAL at Toronto Fringe, where it began almost a decade ago. Right now, this witty, beautiful, and ultimately hopeful piece is a needed reminder of the value of love and human connection, as we step cautiously back into our world feeling more disconnected than ever before.

This audio version was produced in September 2020, with the support of a Canada Council for the Arts. by a team of artists who were all supposed to be elsewhere: performing on Broadway, at Stratford, on tour. Circumstance (or COVID) is the reason this outstanding group was available to come together. With protocols, in a time when they had been told they had to stop creating, they created this piece.

Featuring Michela Cannon (Broadway's Harry Potter), Kaleb Alexander (Shaw Festival 2021), Jennifer Villaverde (Hana's Suitcase: Dora Winner), and Fiona Reid (Broadway's Harry Potter, Order of Canada), with sound design by Pauline McGibbon Award-winner Deanna H. Choi and original music by Matt Barber, written and directed by the uniquely talented Julia Lederer, this audio drama adaptation is a wonderful way to bring WITH LOVE AND A MAJOR ORGAN home, in its fully realised form. This is a celebrated Canadian play that has never been in Canada. Now it will be accessible across the country.

JULIA LEDERER: WRITER, DIRECTOR, PRODUCER

Julia is an internationally acclaimed writer from Toronto. Her plays have been produced all over North America and in Europe and her films have screened at major festivals including: the Toronto International Film Festival; Palm Springs Film Festival; MOTELX (Lisbon); Rouen Nordic Film Festival (France); POFF Black Nights (Estonia), with *Spooning* and *It's Nothing* streaming on the CBC's Gem. Julia worked on *Kim's Convenience* as part of CBC's emerging writers' room, and is currently in development on her own series, *Safe Space*, with Sharp House (UK). Her feature film, inspired by *With Love and a Major Organ*, received Regional Telefilm funding and goes into production in January. During COVID, she wrote two of BetterHelp's most popular commercial spots and recorded several audio pieces for theatres and podcasts in Canada, the U.S., and the U.K. www.julialederer.ca

Since, it has been performed all over the United States and translated into French. The original 60-minute version is <u>published by J.G. Shillingford Publishing</u>.
